Duration of the study

The course is structured to take 8 sixteen- week semesters or 4 academic calendar years (2 trimesters in an academic calender year), in addition to practicum. However, the period can be shortened to 3 calendar years by registering for the 3 trimesters in a calender year.

Students who register with a Diploma in Counseling from a reputable institution in the relevant specialization may be allowed to transfer relevant credits into their registered programme.

Intakes per year
