# Mode of Study

Full time students are expected to complete their programme in 2 years. ODLM students are expected to complete their programme in 2-3 years. A candidate who needs to extend the time limits is required to make a special request to the Board of Postgraduate studies on recommendation of the Department.



It also targets clergy engaged in the education sector as chaplain, education secretaries and pastoral care providers to youth. The programme prepares students for positions in primary schools, secondary schools, teachers colleges, universities, religious ministries specializing in education issues and provides entry into doctoral programmes. The main catchment for MA religious studies are the Primary, Secondary and College teachers who hold a Bachelor's degree in relevant fields and wish to specialize in Religious Education as a teaching subject.
