Programme objectives

The Bachelor of Education (Arts) programme is designed to prepare educators and institutional counselors in secondary and tertiary education institutions locally, regionally and internationally. The programme not only offers knowledge and skills in the broad area of education, but also allows specialization in teaching humanities in secondary school education. In addition, the strong guidance and counceling foundation courses ground graduate teachers to be well equipped as counselors in education institutional settings.

In line with the university's mission, the programme aims at training education and counseling, by equipping them with skills and knowledge to meet the challenges facing individuals and communities, thus contributing to the positive transformation of our society.

Admission requirements

A mean grade of C+ (Plus) at K.C.S.E level Equivalent Qualifications

1. 2 principals and 1 subsidiary at A -level

2. A grade C (plain) and a Diploma in Education from a recognized institution.

The modes of study for the Bachelor of Education and Counseling (Arts) programme are as follows;

- 1. Full-time
- 2. School-based Mode

- 4. Distance Learning Mode

Study centres

The programme is available in the following centers

- 1. Meru Campus (Full- time, DLM & School -Based Only)

Duration of the study

The programme is structured to take 8 sixteenweek semesters or 4 academic calendar years (2 trimesters in an academic calendar year), in addition to teaching practice. However, the period can be shortened to 3 calendar years by registering for the 3 trimesters in a calendar year.

Intakes per year

The intakes for this programme are in April, August, and December for school-based students, and in January, May and September for full-time, DLM, and part-time students. However, eligible students can apply for admission throughout the year.

Credit transfers

Students who register with a Diploma in Education or Counselling from a reputable institution in the relevant specialization may be allowed to transfer relevant credits into the programme.

Employment opportunities

Graduates from this programme can be employed as humanities graduate teachers in secondary schools and tertiary education institutions or as humanities secondary school curriculum evaluators and designers. They can also be employed as secondary education quality assurance officers as well as secondary education experts in NGOs and other organizations that deal with secondary school education
