Programme objectives

The Bachelor of Education (Primary Option) programme is designed to prepare educators and institutional counselors in primary schools and primary teachertraining colleges locally, regionally and internationally. The programme not only offers knowledge and skills in the broad area of education, but also allows specialization in primary education. In addition, the strong guidance and counseling foundation courses ground graduate teachers to be well equipped as counselors in their respective institutional settings.

In line with the university's mission, the programme aims at training education and counseling leaders, by equipping them with skills and knowledge to meet the challenges facing individuals and communities, thus contributing to the positive transformation of our society.

Admission requirements

A mean grade of C+ (Plus) at K.C.S.E level. Equivalent Qualifications

1. 2 principals and 1 subsidiary at A-level

2. A grade C (plain) and a PI Certificate.

Modes of study

The modes of study for the Bachelor of Education and Counseling (Primary Option) programme are as follows; 1. School-based Mode

Duration of the study

The programme is structured to take (8) sixteen-week semesters or 4 academic calendar years (2 trimesters in an academic calendar year), in addition to teaching practice. However, the period can be shortened to (3) calendar years by registering for the 3 trimesters in a calendar year.

Intakes per year

The intakes for this programme are in April, August, and December for schoolbased students and in January, May, and September for part-time students. However, eligible students can apply for admission throughout the year.

Credit transfers

Students who register with a Diploma in Education or Counseling from a reputable institution in the relevant specialization may be allowed to transfer relevant credits into the programme.

Employment opportunities

Graduates from this programme can be employed as graduate teachers in primary schools and primary teacher-training colleges, primary school curriculum evaluators and designers, primary education quality assurance officers or as primary education experts in NGOs and other organizations that deal with basic education.
