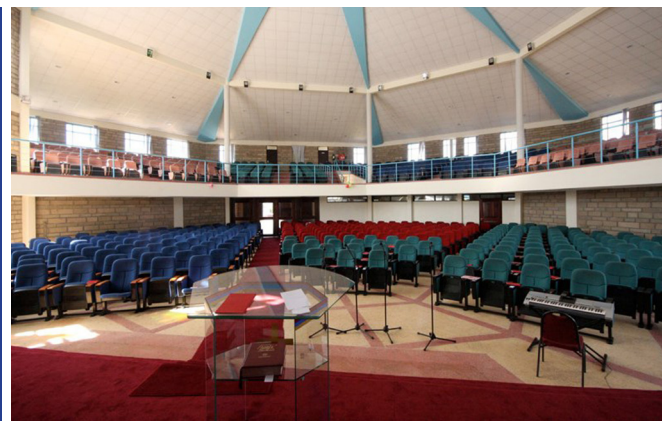

Admission

- Admission is at the beginning of every Trimester I.e. January, May and September.
- Admission requirement is a minimum University entrance requirement of a mean grade C+ or students with C plain with post secondary qualification from a recognised institution.

Academic Calendar

KeMU operates a Trimester system in one calendar year. It is therefore possible for our students to cover four year program in three calendar years.
