Master of Arts in Mission Studies

The department of Theology and Religious Studies offers a postgraduate programme in Theology leading to the award of Master of Arts degree in Mission Studies (M.A.). The Curriculum is designed to provide academic and ecclesiastical professional competence to learners. The programme prepares students for positions in the Christian ministry, para-church bodies dealing with conflict resolution, educational Institutions and aids entry into doctoral programmes.

The Master of Arts in Mission Studies curriculum offers advanced studies in Biblical and theological foundations for missions, evangelism in the African context, inter-religious dialogue and contemporary contextual theologies relevant to church planting and church growth. Further, it equips students with the necessary competency to undertake research in the discipline.

Objectives of the programme

- a) To help the learner to establish Christian Evangelization in the African context.
- b) Help the learner contribute to spiritual and moral transformation of the society through evangelization model.
- Equip the learner with necessary information and guidance on church renewal and contemporary mission trends.
- d) To help the learner in guiding the church on ecumenism and inter-religious dialogue.
- e) Help the leaner to provide appropriate approach to rural and urban Ministry.

Duration of study

Full time students are expected to complete their programme in 2 years. ODLM students are expected to complete their programme in 2-3 years. A candidate who needs to extend the time limit is
