Master of Public Health (MPH) Programme

About the Programme

The Master of Public Health is designed to train specialists in public health capable of addressing these issues that will ultimately help to enhance good health and sustainable population health and impart knowledge, skills and appropriate attitudes and practice which are important for public health improvement and maintenance for sustainable levels of population health.

This will go a long way to check the imbalance by building capacity for public health in Kenya and the region for addressing improvement and maintenance of population health.

The goal of the MPH programme is to enable students acquire competences to improve the quality of public health services through effective management of the population health care systems.

Expected Learning Outcomes

By the end of the programme, the graduate shall be able to: -

- Provide professional leadership in the practice of public health, including planning and implementation of public health programmes for health promotion, and disease prevention and control.
- Advice policy makers and public health administrators on appropriate measures for health promotion, and disease prevention and control.
- Provide leadership for the conduct of public health surveillance and inspection for identification of health risks / hazards for the prevention of related disasters and adverse effects.
- 4. Plan, implement and evaluate training programmes for public health practitioners including health professionals and community members.
- Participate in and contribute to the conduct public health research and dissemination of ensuing information.
- 6. Participate in and contribute to formulation, development and dissemination of public health policies.

- Actively support the enforcement of public health laws, by-laws and regulations under relevant Acts relating to public health.
- 8. Contribute to and participate in Continuing Professional Development of Public Health.

Career Opportunities

The modern health care systems are faced with a lot of challenges, i.e. that of dealing with rapidly increasing population and the need to improve and maintain the health of populations, mainly through promotive and preventive health care. The health systems are overwhelmed by the numbers of people seeking curative care services that is ever increasing. Graduates of the Master of Public Health Programme shall be able to work in different types of health care organisations at various levels to enable the organizations to promote provision of public health services for health promoting and disease preventing, hence reducing the need for more curative care by reducing morbidity and ultimately the consequent unnecessary mortality. The Master of Public Health graduate is shall also be able to conduct research on the distribution and determinants of different health conditions and diseases, providing evidence for policy development and implementation.

Minimum Admission Requirements

Candidates for admission to Master of Public Health degree programme shall be required to have obtained:

EITHER

(i) Be a holder of Bachelors of Science degree in health and health related disciplines, including Public Health, Environmental Health, Medicine, Surgery, Dentistry, Nursing, Pharmacy, Medical Laboratory Science, Nutrition, Biostatistics / Health Statistics, Psychology.

OR

(ii) Be a holder of any other Bachelor's degree or equivalent qualifications in health related social sciences **AND** 2 years' working experience in the health sector.

OR

(iii) Be a holder of any other qualifications acceptable to the University Senate as equivalent to either of the above.

Credit Requirements

- The Master of Public Health programme will be offered through coursework and research thesis. KEMU employs a trimester system in running its programs. An Academic year consists of three trimesters each consisting of fifteen (15) weeks in total.
- b) KEMU uses a Credit Course or Credit Hour System in determining the number of hours covered in a programme per trimester. One Credit Course or Credit Hour is equivalent to fifteen (15) contact hours. One (1) contact hour is equivalent to 50 minutes of teaching time.
- c) Where a course in the programme shall be taught through tutorials or practicum, one (1) credit hour will be defined as follows:
 Tutorial: One (1) credit hour shall be equivalent to thirty (30) hours of student's time

 Practicum: One (1) credit hour shall be up to 45 hours of student's time.
- d) A student is deemed to have completed the programme after covering the total number of credit hours required in the programme and after satisfying all the university graduation requirements.

Duration of Study

a) The MPH degree is a two-year programme having 65 credit hours. The programme will take a minimum duration of two (2) academic years or six (6) trimesters for full-time and part-time students and three (3) academic years or nine (9) trimesters for a distant learning student. The maximum period allowed is three (3) academic years or nine (9) trimesters for a full-time student and four (4) academic years or twelve (12) trimesters for a part-time student.
