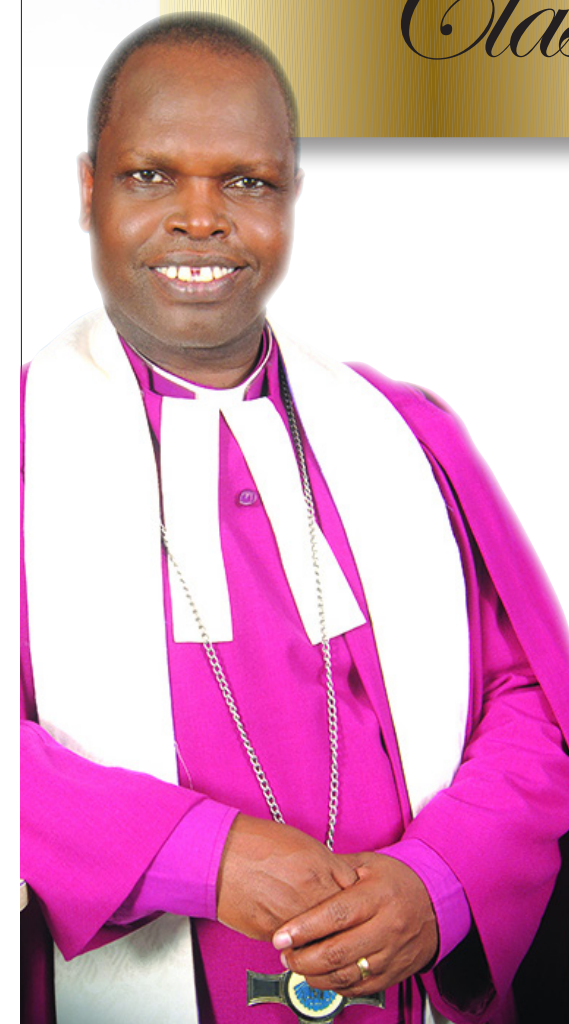

The government's development goals are defined in the Big Four Agenda that includes affordable housing, universal health coverage, manufacturing and food security and nutrition.

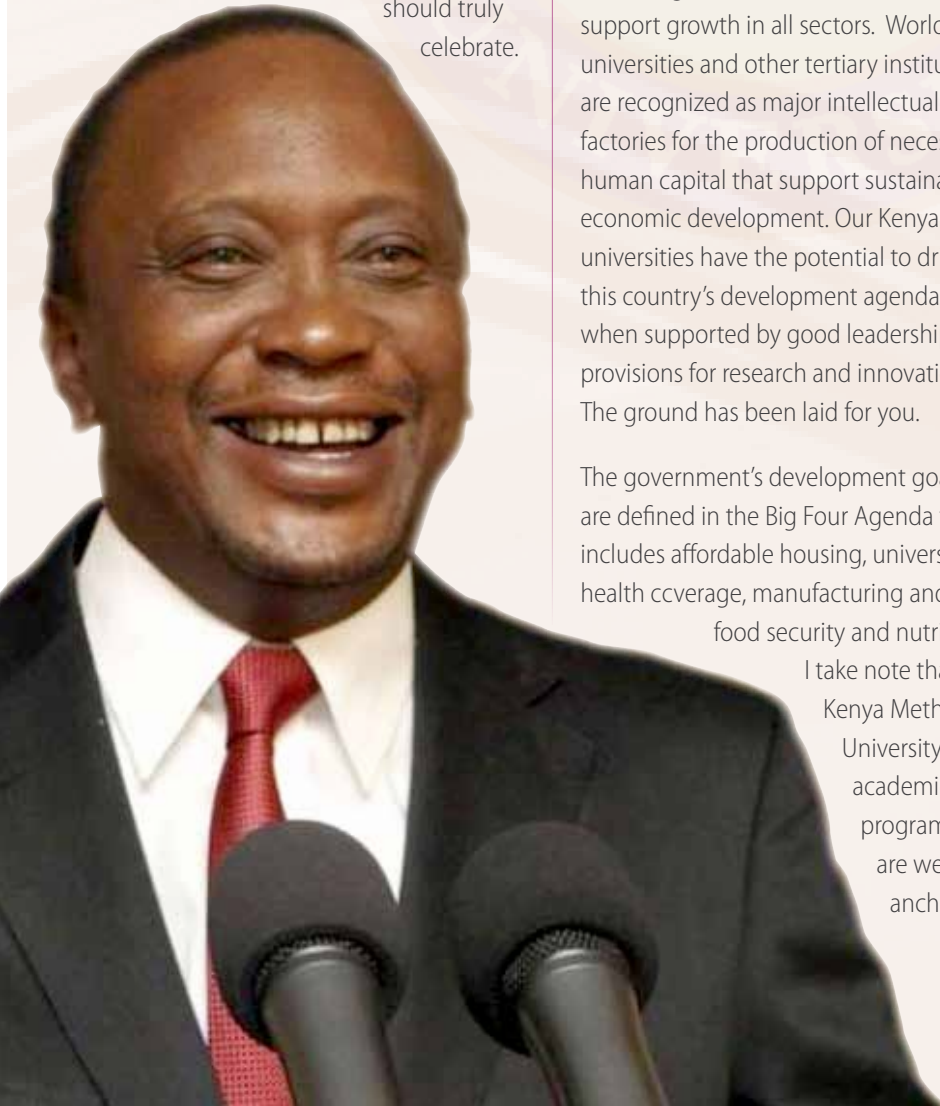
I take note that Kenya Methodist University's academic programmes are well anchored

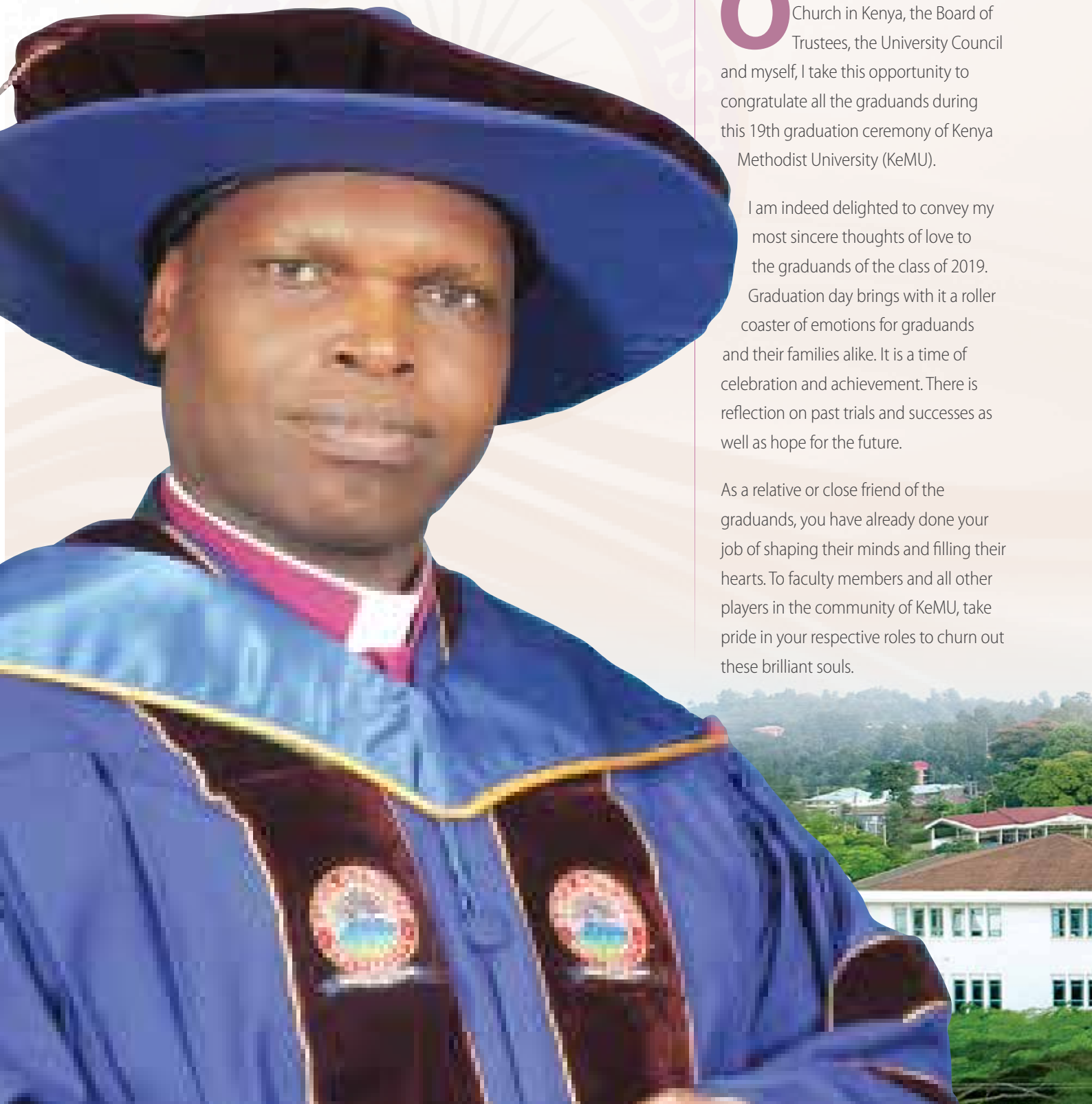

I first heard about Kenya Methodist University (KeMU) in 2007 from my colleague when I reported to work in Meru Prison as a Prisons Constable. After settling down at my work station, I decided to visit KeMU Main Campus to enquire about their academic programs. 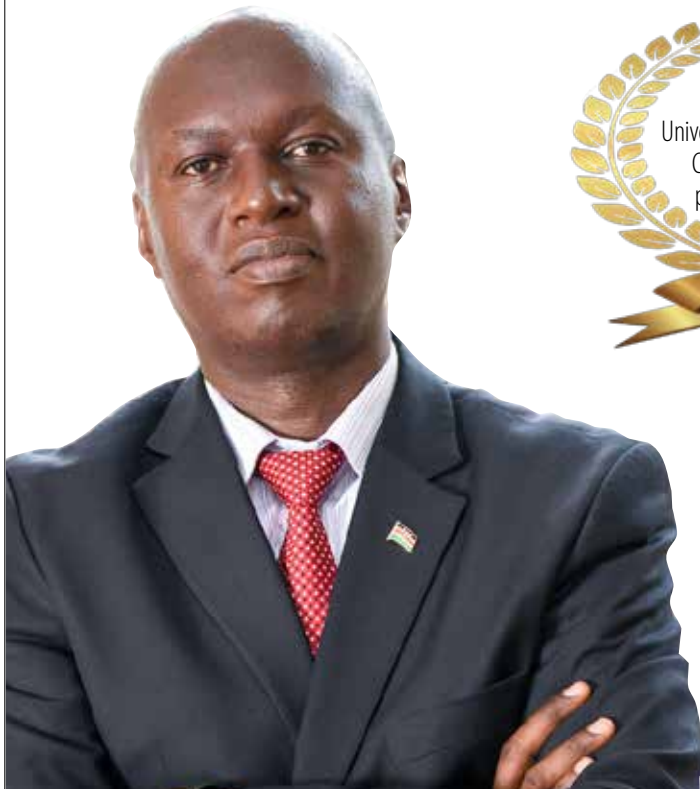
