## KeMU Holdings Ltd

KeMU Holding Ltd (KHL) is a limited company where KeMU is a holding/parent company as defined in Sec 3(1) of the Company's Act No. 17, 2015. KHL Incorporation was informed by the need for the university to pursue two main objectives, namely; (i) offload non-core activities from the university and (ii) make KHL a profit making entity for the university.

The Kenya Methodist University has various income generation units. These are the University Farms at Kithoka and Marimanti, University Cafeteria, car parks, and the University Medical Center. These perform non-core businesses which generate substantial income to the University. The company was registered in 2015 and started the operations in January 2020.

The units are essential for both staff and students welfare like the cafeteria and clinical services. Efficient management

of the University farm has drastically cut down on cost of raw food supplies to the cafeteria and has improved farm income. The farm and the cafeteria supplement each other perfectly. To operationalize the KHL, the University embarked on recruitment of a Chief Executive Officer who is the General Manager of the Holdings and runs the businesses on behalf of the University.

In retrospect my recollections takes me back to 21st July 2013 when I graduated from Kenya Methodist University with a Master of Arts degree in Religious Studies in this very same venue.
