



he School of Education and Social Sciences identified, discussed and recommended Rev Richard Teal for conferment of the honorary Degree of Kenya Methodist University.

Mr. Chancellor Sir, It is now my pleasure to present to you Rev. Dr. Richard J. Teal, the former President of the Methodist Conference of Great Britain and Northern Ireland for the degree of Doctor of Divinity and Leadership (Honaris Causa)

Rev. Dr. Richard has had an outstanding ministry in Britain having trained at Wesley College, Bristol and been ordained to the Methodist ministry in 1984.

Participation in community service in Britain and Education: Policy 2.6 (i)

Richard has demonstrated distinguished achievement in community service activities. His first posting was to Gateshead where he displayed his innovative skills by using Church buildings as a meeting place for the unemployed and as a base for Training schemes for the unemployed including providing debt counselling to affected persons after the closure of the Coal mines and Shipyards.

Participation in community service: Policy 2.6 (i)

Richard has demonstrated distinguished achievement in community service activities in Scotland. At a very early stage in his ministry, Richard made sure that the Gospel of Jesus Christ was relevant to ordinary people in order to make a difference to their lives.

In 1987, Richard at the age of 28 was appointed Superintendent of the Berwick upon Tweed Circuit, which is on the borders of England and Scotland, and indeed Berwick has sometimes been in Scotland! This was a creative appointment by the Church to appoint Richard at such a young age to a post of such huge responsibility. The circuit was scattered but Richard used his huge energy to renovate a number of churches and the main church at Berwick experienced huge growth in numbers. The local Member of Parliament described Richard as 'The most pastoral, gifted and innovative minister he has met.

Doctor of Divinity and Leadership (Honaris Causa) Rev. Dr. Richard J. Teal

Transformative mission of the University: policy 2.6 (ii)

Richard personifies the core value of the University as transformative leader. In 1995 Richard was appointed as the Superintendent Minister in the Beverley Circuit, East Yorkshire during a period when the church was divided. Rev Richard was able to turn the Church around, experienced growth of its congregants and was awarded the Prestigious Award for services to the community by the East Riding of Yorkshire. It was after this success and distinguished ministry, that the Church appointed Richard to be the Chair of the Cumbria District, which is equivalent to the role of Bishop.

Reconciliation

This is at the heart of Richard's ministry. He initiated and established with other Church leaders the first ecumenical County in Great Britain. This was a huge achievement and has become the template for further ecumenical work in England. The Churches in Cumbria were thrilled when Richard was made an Honorary Canon of Carlisle Cathedral in recognition of his work.

Crusader of people to live their lives on a large canvas

This is one of the aspects of his ministry. This was evidenced in the establishment of a partnership between The Cumbria Methodist District and the Methodist Church of Argentina.

Scholarship contribution: Policy 2.6 (iii)

Richard is a rural specialist and has made scholarly contributions. In 2017 he co-edited a workbook to help promote and sustain an effective Christian presence in rural communities called 'A Discipling Presence'. The book is currently being used in the Methodist Church in Great Britain to help, support and enable rural mission.

Distinguished achievements in community service: Policy 2.6 (ii)

Leadership roles can be hugely exacting, especially in times of crisis, and often provide a proving ground for capable leaders in the community. The region of Cumbria experienced terrible flooding rendering many people homeless with large areas of the district were under water. During this period, Rev. Richard provided leadership, guidance and displaced empathy for the people by visiting the communities, encouraging distressed people and being part of the visit by the Prince of Wales. He also provided a prophetic voice to the situation in interviews with the press and on radio.

Strong relationship with Kenya Methodist University.

Rev. Richard has had an outstanding ministry and is an excellent teacher and preacher. British Methodism is immensely proud to have him as their President. Earlier this year Richard and his wife Sue made an official visit to the Methodist Church in Kenya. This was a significant visit for Richard, Sue and for the Methodist people who met them.

Provision of exceptional service explained/ significant contributing to Teaching, Learning and research) as per the policy 2.6(v) and Theology as per policy (ix).

Rev Richard funded the shelving of KeMU Library in support of core Business of the University. Rev. Richard facilitated the donation of Theology Books to KeMU from Methodist Universities abroad.

Rev. Richard conducted to various capacity building training sessions in Methodist Churches in Kenya in his Endeavour to build the body of Christ here in Kenya, Rev. Richard has spearheaded a partnership between KeMU, the Methodist church in Kenya and Great Britain to enhance learning, research and exchange programmes. Rev. Richard endorses mission partners for teaching and learning without pay.

It is out humble opinion that Rev. Richard Teal has made exceptional contributions to academia and to the betterment of culture and society internationally and development of KeMU, which merits him for this honor as per Policy (vii). Rev. Richard Teal has had an excellent ministry, has shown that he is a person of first class caliber.
