OUR CHIEF GUEST

Rev. Dr. Jane Leach, Principal of Wesley House, The Methodist Theological College, Cambridge, UK.

t is my great pleasure to be joining you today and sharing in your success. I bring you greetings from Wesley House, the Methodist College in Cambridge where I am Principal, and where your Chancellor and I studied theology together many years ago. I thank him, the Vice Chancellor, the Board, the Staff and all those who have supported you personally through the journey of your lives to this point. This is a real milestone to celebrate.

Milestones are an opportunity to pause, to mark how far you have come and to look at the horizon and think about where you are headed. They are an opportunity to remember who you have travelled with to this point, to take nourishment and rest a little while with those who are with you now, and then to set your course into the unknown.

Setting a course means deciding on your destination. Whether you use an old-fashioned compass or the GPS application on your phone to work out your route, you need to know what your goal is going to be. Where are you headed? What is going to be the driving purpose of your life? Then you can take the next steps.

> A university education is a privilege in any setting. It gives you knowledge, skills and networks that can be set to any purpose. But from those who have received much, much is expected.

Last month I was in Nashville at an international gathering of Methodist colleges and universities from around the world. In a seminar on vaccine equity, we heard from Dr James Hildreth, an African American boy who has grown up to be a leading virologist who has invested his life in seeking to understand and arrest the spread of the HiV virus, and in more recent years, the Covid 19 virus. Now the President of Meharry Medical School in Nashville Tennessee he was asked by the audience why, when he already had achieved so much success, he had responded to the government's call for scientists and leaders who could help to steer the US response to Covid 19. It has been an uphill struggle trying to persuade reluctant ethnic minority populations who have been abused by pharmaceutical companies in the past to take up the vaccine, he said. And an uphill struggle to persuade pharmaceutical companies and the US government that it is in the best interests of everyone to make affordable vaccines available across the whole world before another deadly variant emerges. But, he said, I was taught by my mother that 'from those who have received much, much is expected'.

At this juncture, fresh out of college with your certificate in your hand, you cannot know what opportunities life will bring that will enable you to make a difference and whether the difference you will make will be on a small scale or on a large scale. You can decide now, though, what kind of difference you want to make and how large a map you want to live on. Who do you seek to serve? And what kind of good do you want to do in the world? Western models of education have the tendency to privilege individual achievement and to shape us as individuals who think that the privilege belongs to us. Wherever Western schooling has had an influence, we are all at a risk of this kind of thinking. African philosophies of life know better, though, that we are only who we are because of who others are and that whatever educational gualifications we have achieved we have not achieved them alone and they are not only for your own benefit but for building up the whole community. And those who have the privilege of having been to a university have received from the best that the universe has to offer and are invited to seek to make a universal difference.

Today is a milestone. It is a day for resting and eating and celebrating with those who have shared the journey, but it is also a day to ask, 'Where I am headed?' 'What impact do I want my life and work to make?''With the knowledge and skills that I now have, who will I serve?'

You cannot now, perhaps plot the whole route to the difference you want to make. You can, though, take this moment as you pause today to check your equipment and choose your companions for the next stage of the journey.

Because to navigate the twists and turns of life in ways that make a positive difference to the lives of others, you will need a compass that is set to true north, and friends and mentors who will keep you true to your best self and the difference you want to make in the world, despite many temptations to stray from the path. This university, with its Methodist identity, has provided you with a compass set to true north. A compass that has the liberating love of God as its north and sets truth and justice and courage as its east and west and south - because for any endeavour to succeed these are the essential reference points.

I encourage you therefore, as you set out on this next leg of the journey, to use this moment to decide what difference you want to make in the world, to use the equipment you have been given at KeMU to navigate the opportunities and challenges ahead, and to choose your companions for the journey because, 'from those who have received much, much is expected'.
