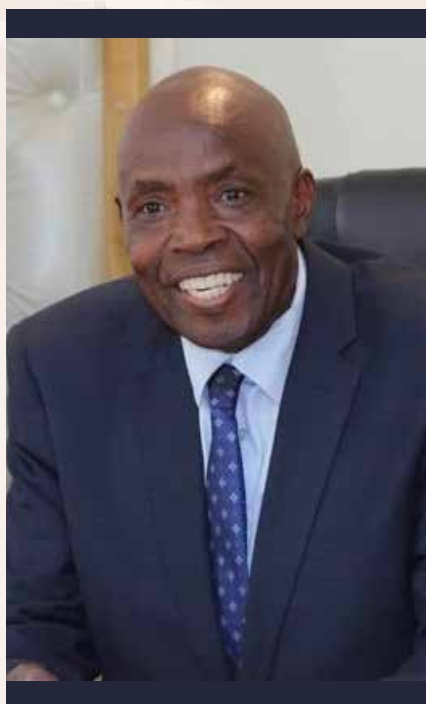


## OUR CHIEF GUEST

Universities will be assured of a regular and reliable income since it is individual-centred. I am happy to note that the private universities such as KeMU are already embracing the model, going by the large number of students who successfully applied for funding through the New Higher Education Funding (NHEF) model for students placed by Kenya Universities and Colleges Central Placement Service (KUCCPS).

Indeed, the University and the entire Methodist fraternity has lost a great man. May his soul continue to rest in eternal peace.

This University has come a long way. As a board, we recognize the efforts made by the governance organs especially the University Council, the University Management Board and the Senate for their relentless efforts in keeping the university as a going concern and maintaining the good brand name. They have navigated through turbulent times to bring the institution to where it is now. It is common knowledge that most universities in this country are struggling with huge

financial burdens and KeMU is no exception. However, our resilience is unmatched and our faith in God will definitely get us out of the challenges and into prosperity.

In the recent past, we have realized substantial pressure in terms of tuition space especially in the main campus. I would like to thank the University management for initiating a project to address, at least in part, the space challenge by starting a building just behind us that is now in its second floor. Once complete, it will substantially ease the pressure on lecture space and laboratories. However, I am aware that financial resources are required to finish the building and equip it. We will be looking into ways and means of partnering with the University to finalize the project.

We have been working on a ten-year Strategic Plan (2018-2027). We have just completed the mid-term review of the Strategy driven by the need to refocus and re-align our dreams and aspirations to the hard economic realities. We are very much alive to the fact that the world has been smarter from the effects of COVID19, global economic turbulence and the



current war in Ukraine which is affecting the entire world in a significant way. The cost of living has gone up substantially fanned by the high cost of fuel and food. The climate change has not helped things and has continued to negatively impact food security in the country. However, we are determined that despite these global and local challenges, we shall endeavor to achieve our aspirations as captured in the reviewed Strategic Plan 2023-2027. In the next four years, we want to do business unusual and we undertake to carry out serious fundraising initiatives locally and abroad to meet our financial obligations. As the Board of Trustees, we give our promise to lead in this front.

Even as we lead in the fundraising initiatives for infrastructural development, we call upon the entire university community to be proactive in fundraising. We are very much aware that most universities run on grants. Ours should not be an exception. We call upon members of faculty to engage in writing competitive grants to attract research funds into the institution and especially those grants that come with some assets like vehicles and training opportunities for post graduate students. We are also very much aware of what linkages to industry and other partners can do to achieve growth. We shall endeavor to follow these linkages and ensure that we rally stakeholders to a

common development cause.

We are cognizant of the efforts that management are making to bring the glory of the university back. Some of the efforts include modernizing the university fleet and refurbishing buildings and equipment. These subtle efforts are bringing back the glow in the university and restoring our brand image. We encourage management to continue on this trajectory.

We want to forge collaborations with industry and like-minded friends both locally and abroad to develop our institution and open opportunities for our youth who are joining the overcrowded unemployment space. We believe in training for skills development which skills can then enable the graduate to innovate and create employment. Although we are aware that it is difficult to begin from nothing, it is also very clear that this is our reality as a country. Our industry is not growing fast enough to create enough job opportunities for our youth. However, this is also not an excuse not to train. It is our belief that with skills, one can always apply knowledge and create opportunities for self and others. Therefore, I encourage the graduands of today to look widely outside but also introspect on their strengths and what they can do instead of lamenting on unemployment for which little can be done.
